




# 2025 SEASON WRAP UP

# PV 2025 INVITATIONAL TEAMS




# TAMARA & VIMY

We asked Tarmara to tell us a little bit about what it was like in her own words:

**“The 2025 NAVHDA Invitational was an unforgettable experience with Vimy, made even sweeter by one of the best weather days of the entire week and a dog who showed up confident, steady, and fully prepared for every phase of the test. We were the first brace in the field that day, and from the moment I sent my dog off, it felt like I was out hunting with friends. What stood out most for me, though, was the water work. It’s my favorite aspect of NAVHDA to train, and it was incredibly rewarding to step back and watch everything come together in the double mark, blind, and honor. I never once questioned whether his performance would be good enough, though I certainly didn’t expect a max 200 score.**

**Preparing for this level of testing is no small undertaking; it demands organization, long-term commitment, access to water and land, reliable training partners, and the discipline to keep showing up long before the Invitational feels real. This experience reinforced just how critical solid obedience and polished retrieving are at the highest levels of NAVHDA testing, and it also reminded me that none of this happens in isolation. A successful dog training journey is only possible with the support of dedicated clubs and training partners, for which I’m incredibly grateful.”**



# RON & FREYA

The NAVHDA Invitational is as much about problem-solving and adaptability as it is about preparation. We asked Ron to share what the experience was like from his perspective, and his story captures both the challenges and the humour that come with testing at the highest level.

**“A trip to the Invitational is always at the top of the list for a NAVHDA dog and Freya was able to punch her ticket for 2025, in 2024 capping off what was a great year for her.**

We worked hard on honouring and had some great water training with Tamara and Vimy, but with not a lot of hot weather for any heat conditioning, but how hot could it be mid-September in Iowa?

As the day drew near it was apparent that it was going to be very hot, 34 degrees hot, as well as a few other contingencies it was hard to train for: a brace mate that would lie down on point. Look! a squirrel! Really! As we were waiting for the blind retrieve (she'd never seen one of those before and much more interesting than fetching a dead duck).

A chukar on the path as we were heading down to the heel and double mark retrieve, now she's excited - not a 'heeling' frame of mind.

Not that it was all bad, second brace in the field so only about 27 degrees as we finished, a final 'fetch over' that got her heading over to get her duck after a fruitless look for squirrels, and an understanding judge that let her calm down a bit before her heeling after the chukar fiasco. Best of all, a PASS and cross that one off the bucket list. Good girl, Freya! Special thanks to Tamara and Vimy and all those that helped with her training, it truly does take a village.”
